Bed bugs can live for a long period—over a year—without a blood meal.

Their bites aren't known to transmit disease, but they are known to transmit psychological anxiety through stress and lack of sleep.

Bed bugs are reddish-brown, typically ¼ of an inch long, oval shaped with six legs. Their small shape allows them to fit into the tiniest of places and camp out for extended periods of time. They travel

in seams and folds of luggage, gym bags, clothes, bedding, furniture, and anywhere they can hide and journey to their next home.

If you want your guests' and tenants' panic contained (and blood staying where it belongs), then avoiding bed bugs at all costs is a must for your property and reputation. The best way to prevent this problematic pest and potential public relations nightmare is regular bed bug inspection by professionals. 

Who's Responsible?

FOR HOTELS, most state laws simply state that the hotel manager must use reasonable care and cleanliness measures to prevent pests and promote guest safety.

FOR PROPERTY OWNERS who rent to tenants, the laws are a little more complex, and you should consult with a lawyer as to specific state law requirements. Generally, nearly all states require landlords to maintain the tenant's premises in a habitable condition, and this is understood to include the eradication of bed bugs. In some instances the owner may have additional requirements, such as providing a bed bug infestation history for the previous year.

Of course, tenants also have responsibilities to notify their landlord of possible infestations and comply with treatment specifications.



21 states have some level of law or regulation that applies to bed bugs.¹⁴

INFILTRATORS:



Bed bugs move from an infested site to a new home by "hitchhiking" in luggage, bags, boxes, clothing, bedding and furniture. Due to the close nature of hospitality, multifamily and office facilities, bed bugs are able to infest multiple rooms by traveling through pipes.


REPRODUCERS:

Adult females produce one to three eggs per day. Eggs hatch within two weeks, and take about five to six weeks to reach adulthood. The average bed bug lives four to six months.¹⁵

Taking a Bite Out of Bed Bug Myths



- The presence of bed bugs means I have sanitation issues.
 - Not necessarily, the presence of bed bugs has little to do with cleanliness or an establishment's sanitation practices. Bed bugs can be found anywhere there is a food source (wherever people are).
- Only establishments with beds need to worry about bed bugs.

 We get it. The name is misleading. Those little blood suckers can literally be found anywhere--from living rooms to kitchens, outside of hotels and homes, and even trains and planes.
- Bed bugs transmit disease.

 Nope. Those little guys do carry more than 30 different human pathogens, but there's no evidence they can transmit disease to humans. Skin irritations from the bites, or even respiratory issues in areas of high infestation are possible, though.¹⁷
- I saw a bed bug jump.

 Lies. Bed bugs can't jump. They are skilled hitchhikers, however. They travel via personal belongings like luggage, purses, gym bags, and items kept close to sleep areas.
- Bed bug infestations are 100% preventable.

 We wish. They cannot be completely prevented because people can bring them into any establishment at any time.
- Bed bugs bit my fur baby!

 Not likely. Bed bugs prefer human blood over pets and furry animals. However, we have seen evidence in large bed bug populations.
- A couple bed bugs never hurt anyone!

 Ha! Bed bugs multiply quickly, and in just six months, a few can turn into a full-on infestation of 13,000 or more creepy crawlies. Detection is critical to break the bed bug life cycle before they become a bigger problem.¹⁸



Identifiable DNA can be retrieved from a bed bug up to 90 days after feeding on its human prey.¹⁹

ATTENTION:

Vacation Rental Owners & Managers

Rental homes along the Jersey Shore fill up with vacationers each summer. The good news is that this is a profitable time for the hospitality industry. The bad news is that high occupancy and more frequent guest turnover increases the likelihood of experiencing every business's worse nightmare: bed bugs.

- Get Ahead
 - As you prepare for the upcoming rental season, develop a plan in case bed bug issues arise. Think through your response in advance and make sure your entire team is on board and understands protocol. Develop a relationship with a pest management provider so you know who to call in the event of a pest problem.
- Ask Customers to Speak Up

 Bed bugs are nocturnal, so by the time one is spotted during the day, your property may have a serious problem. Encourage guests to report any pest sightings immediately and provide clear instructions for who they should contact. Addressing an issue upfront allows you the opportunity to salvage the guest's experience and can help prevent costly remediation down the road.
- Diligence is Key

 Require cleaning or maintenance crews to inspect the home for bed bugs between each guest stay and implement more thorough inspections monthly and at the beginning and end of the rental season.
- Make it Shine
 Stick to a thorough cleaning program to help eliminate hiding places. Staff should clean thoroughly and wash all linens after each guest stay and put them in the dryer on the hottest setting for a full cycle.
- Avoid Used Furnishings

 There are a lot of benefits to thrift store shopping and yard sales, but one of the downfalls is the high risk of bed bugs throughout second-hand furniture. Used furniture can introduce bed bugs into a property. If older furniture is bought, it should be inspected and treated before bringing it into the residence.
- Use Proactive Programs

 Properly trained bed bug scent detection dogs are effective in finding new introductions before they become noticeable infestations.
- Don't DIY

 Botched DIY pest control attempts can prolong the window to resolving the problem and cost your business more money once a licensed provider is called. Leave it to the professionals, as they have the experience and tools to properly treat a bed bug problem.

- × Small bugs
- × Cast skins or eggs
- × Small dark stains on sheets, mattresses, bed frames or headboards
- × Itchy bite marks on legs and arms
- × Musty, sweet smell, mostly associated with heavy infestations

PREVENTION TIPS:

- × Ask your tenants, maintenance or housekeeping staff to keep an eye out for potential hiding places, such as buckling wallpaper or carpet that may house bed bugs.
- **×** Encourage staff and tenants to immediately report any bed bug issues to maintenance/management.
- × Train housekeeping staff to look for signs during room cleanings.
- × Immediately quarantine any bed bug-infested units, room(s) and any adjoining rooms for inspection and treatment if needed.
- f x Utilize proactive programs, like canine bed bug detection.
- **x** Communicate with tenants on how to identify bed bugs and prevent them from entering.

- × Any other cracks and crevices around the bed and other furniture



AFTER EVERY GUEST/OCCUPANT, CHECK:

× Upholstered furniture

× Dresser drawers

× Chair cushions

× Behind hanging frames and wall fixtures

× Baseboards and corners

- × Luggage racks
- × Drapes and shades
- × Electrical outlets and plates



YEARLY:

- Remove headboards and check behind them
- × Inspect under carpet
- ★ Check behind wallpaper

Use a flashlight while inspecting - the one on your phone will work!
